



### From the Desk of Fr. Leo

The first sentence of the Bible tells of God's loving power, creating and embracing the virgin waters of the earth. A few verses later in Genesis 1:20, He calmly says, "let the water abound with life." And so it did, not only with fishes and other creatures of the deep, but with the energetic life of the Maker. His presence is still manifested today, shouting from the surging ocean waves and gently reflected in the noiseless rivers. We see His lifegiving graces in a cool, refreshing drink of water and there are memories of His suffering in our warm salty tears.

Having inherited His tempered power and balanced wisdom, the waters faithfully serve their Master. The same great flood both destroyed life and also saved the faith-built ark of Noah. The Red Sea drowned the charging Egyptians only after it had protected the fleeing Hebrews. In baptism, also poured with the water over the infant's head, are the demanding commitment to Christian integrity and the grace to accomplish it.

In the First Reading, Jeremiah proclaims water to be the symbol of God, speaking of divine blessings under the image of the flowing streams Any person, he warns, who tries to live without God's blessings will become an isolated barren bush in the desert, dwelling in "a lava waste, a salt and empty earth."

The season of Lent gives a clear call to those engaged in empty or sinful pursuits, to revisit the stream of renewal and find again their true source of strength. "Blessed is the man who trusts in the Lord," says the prophet Jeremiah, for he "is like a tree planted beside the waters," Shall I be a barren, dying bush or a green, growing tree? That is the question. It's my decision – the choice of the two ways.

We should not view this season of reform as a heavy imposition, but as a joyful invitation to work in and with the Church for personal and community improvement. If we stay near our lifegiving source, Jeremiah assures us that we will not wither from the deadly heat or the lure of sin.

We should note how Psalm 1, used as the Responsorial for this liturgy resonates the same Scriptural overtures as Jeremiah. Both prophet and psalmist testify that life without God is like trying to live without water. These voices of the Old Testament prepare hurting humanity to hear the call of Jesus: "Come...I will refresh you."


